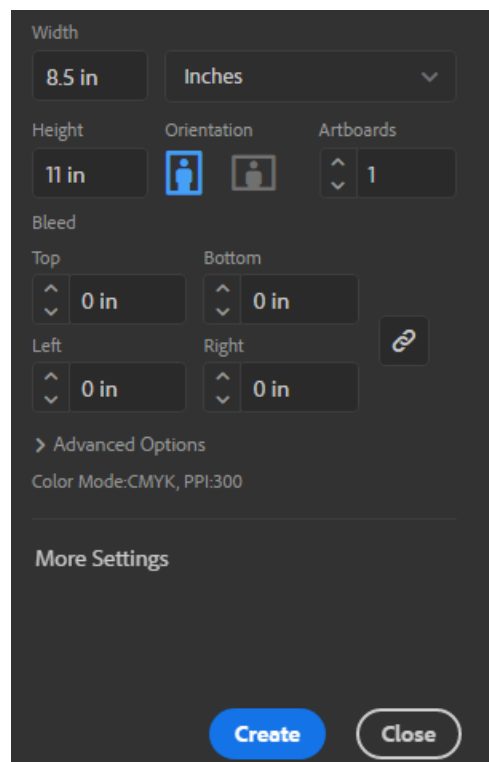
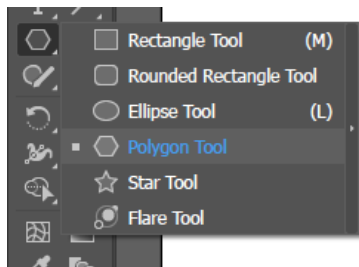

 Lesson 10 – Honey Bee Sore Throat Lozenges
 Skills: Effects, Scissor Tool, Type Tools

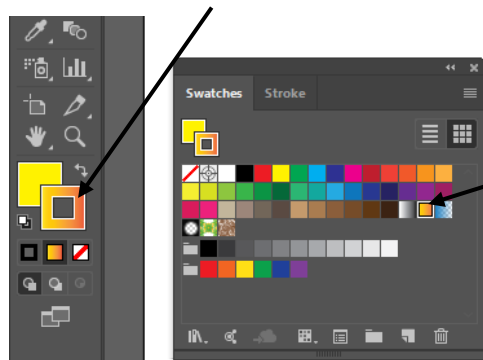
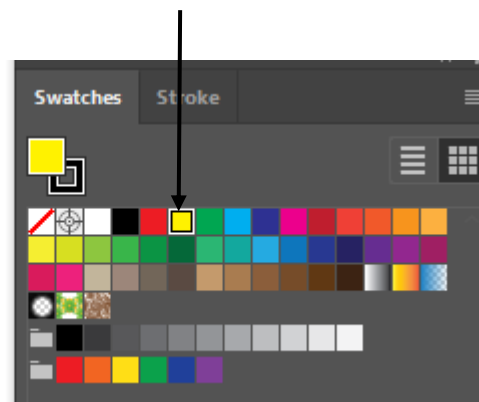
1. File>New. Width = 8.5, Height = 11 and Unit = inches.
Click Create



2. Select the Polygon tool by holding down the Rectangle tool to open the menu:



3. Click the Fill color box to bring it to the front of the Stroke color. Click any yellow on your Swatch menu to set the Fill color to yellow.

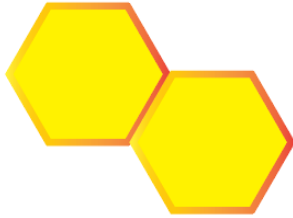


4. Click the Stroke color box to bring it to the front. Click the orange gradient on your Swatch menu:

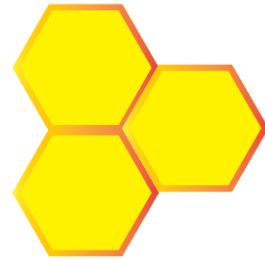
5. Draw the polygon shape. You should get this:



6. Click the shape with your Black Arrow tool. Go to Edit>Copy. Then Edit>Paste to make a copy. Place it as shown:

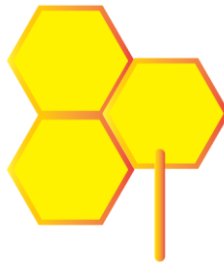
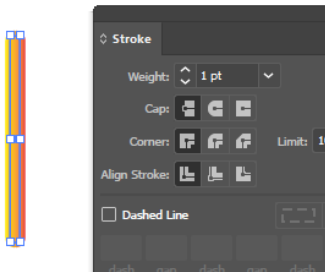


7. Select one of the shapes with the Black Arrow tool. Make another copy and place it as shown:

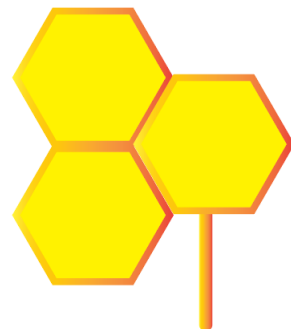


Part II: The Drip

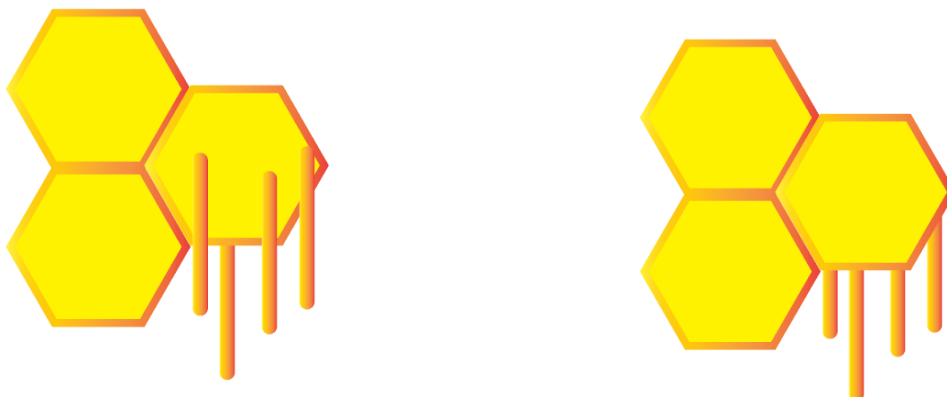
8. Select the Rounded Rectangle Tool. Draw a thin rounded rectangle shape. Then go to Window>Stroke. Make sure the Weight is set to 1. This will keep the lines of the shape thin. Place the rounded rectangle as shown.



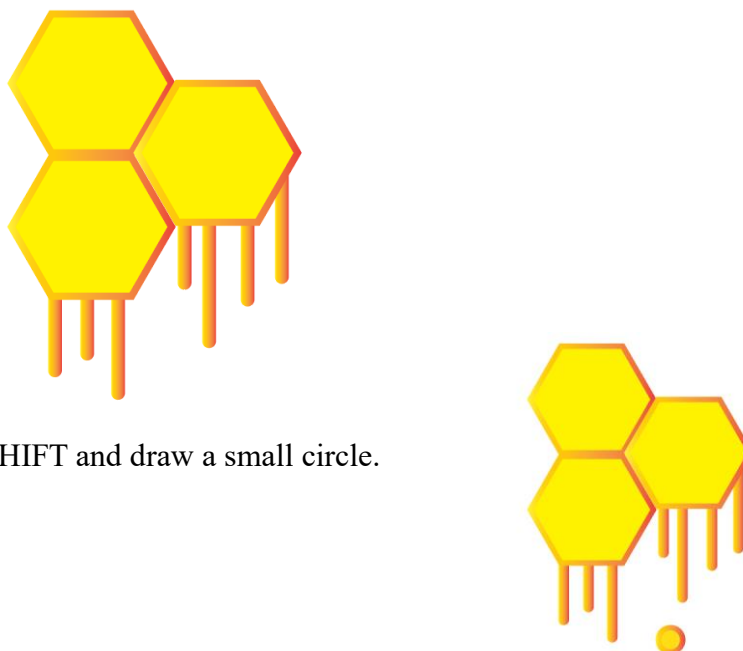
9. Select the rectangle shape with the Black Arrow tool. Go to Object>Arrange>Send to Back.



10. Select the rectangle shape. Go to Edit>Copy, then Edit>Paste, or hold ALT and drag a copy of the rectangle. Then make two more copies. Place them as shown. Then go to Object>Arrange>Send to Back for each one to send them to the back.

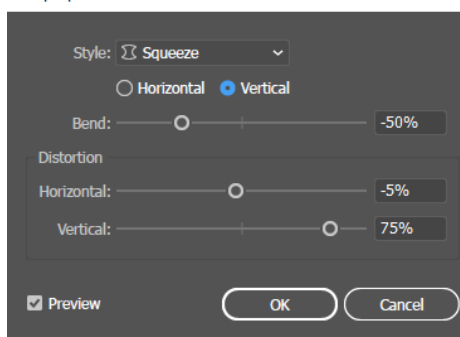


11. Make three more copies and place them as shown:



12. Select the Ellipse tool. Hold SHIFT and draw a small circle.

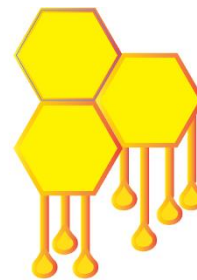
Warp Options



13. Select the circle with the Black Arrow tool. Go to Effect>Warp>Squeeze. Use these settings. You should get something like this tear drop shape:

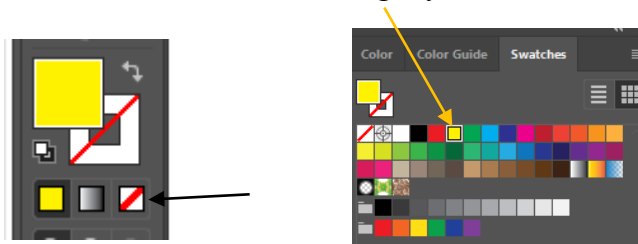


14. Select the tear drop shape. Go to Edit>Copy, Edit>Paste and make six copies. Place them as shown. Move the rounded rectangles if necessary to make everything fit.

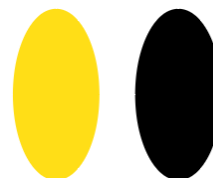


Part III: The Bees

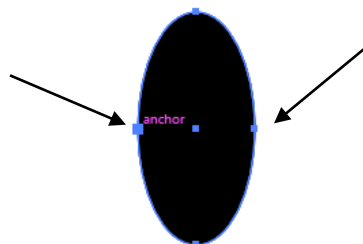
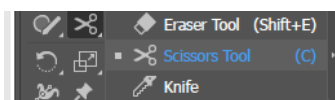
15. Set the Stroke color to None and the Fill color to a bright yellow.



16. Select the Ellipse tool. Draw a thin egg shape as shown. Then make a copy and change the Fill color to black.



17. Select the black egg shape with the Black Arrow tool. Hold the Eraser tool button to open the menu. Select the Scissor tool. Click on the middle left anchor point. Then click on the middle right anchor point.



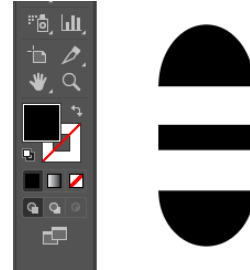
18. Select the Black Arrow tool. Click the bottom part of the shape. It should now be cut in half. Drag the bottom part of the shape down.



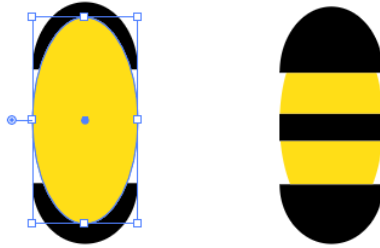
19. Click on the bottom shape and pull the top down to squish it a little. Then do the same for the top part.



20. Select the Rectangle Tool. Set the Fill color to black.
Draw a rectangle and place it as shown.



21. With the Black Arrow tool, drag the yellow shape onto the black parts. With the yellow shape selected, go to Object>Arrange>Send to Back

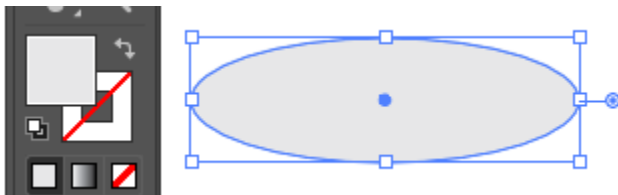


22. Click on the black shapes with the Black Arrow tool and resize them if necessary to get something like this:

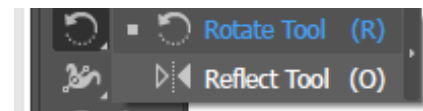


23. Draw an invisible box around the bee shape with the Black Arrow tool to select all the parts of the bee. Go to Object>Group.

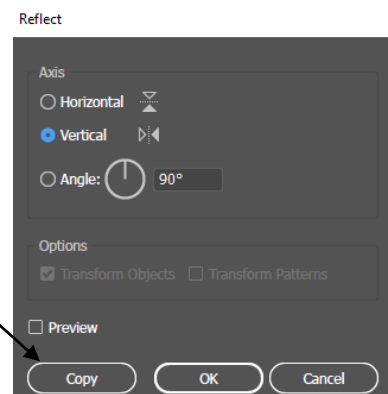
24. Select the Ellipse tool. Set the Fill color to a light gray. Draw an oval shape for the wings.



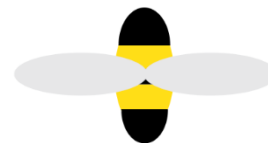
25. Select the oval shape with the Black Arrow tool. Click the Reflect tool.



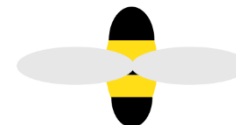
26. Double-click the Reflect tool. On the Reflect tool menu, select copy.



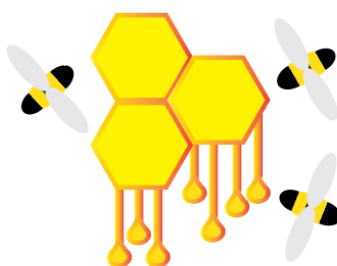
27. Drag the copy of the oval shape off to the side with the Black Arrow tool. Then place them as shown for the wings.



28. With the Black Arrow tool, draw an invisible box around all parts of the bee. Go to Object>Group.



29. Select the bee. Edit>Copy, Edit>Paste. Make two copies and place them as shown:



30. Select your Type tool.



31. Set your Fill color to black.



32. Click anywhere on your artboard. You will get some starter text:

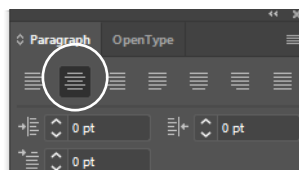

33. Change the text to Honey Bee, press ENTER and type Throat Lozenges:

Throat Lozenges

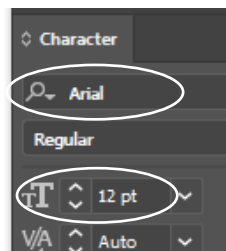
34. Select the Black Arrow tool. Go to Window>Type>Paragraph. Click the Align Center button. You should get this:

35. Go to Window>Type>Character. Choose any font style you want and change the size of the text if you want.

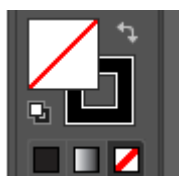
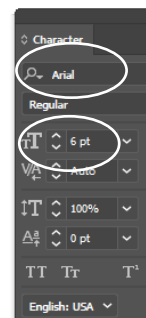
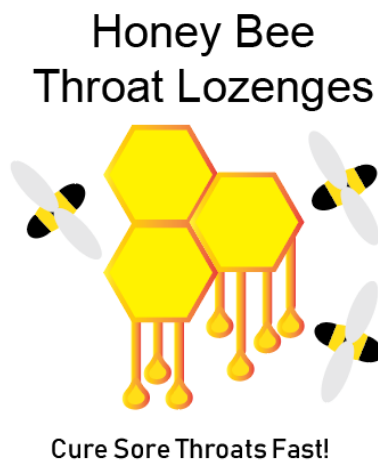

36. Place the text as shown with your Black Arrow tool:



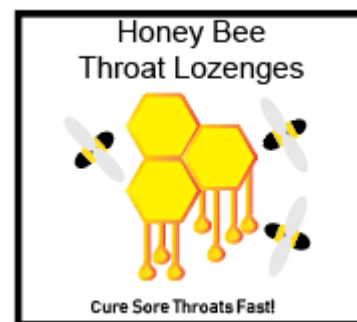
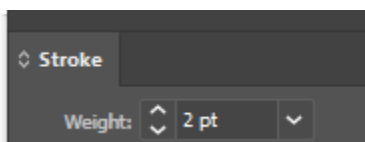
37. Select your Type tool again. Add the following text. Use any font style you want. Make it smaller – any size you want.



38. Finally, select your Rectangle tool.



Set the Fill color to None and the Stroke to black. Draw a square as shown. Go to Window>Stroke and change the weight (thickness) of the line to 2pts. That's it – you're done!

Can you make this logo with polygon shapes?
