

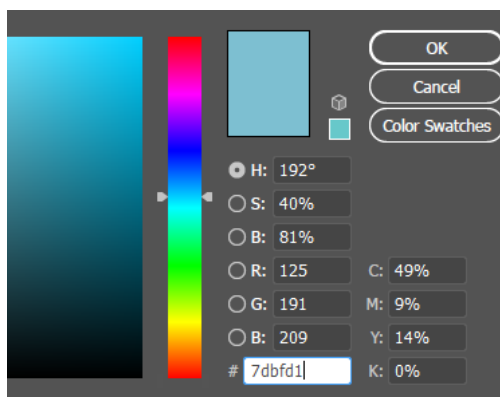

Lesson 6 – Candy Corner

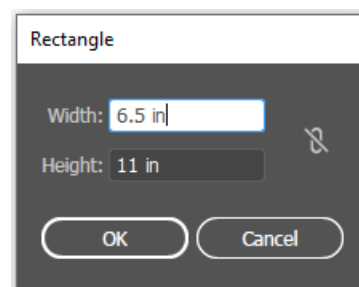
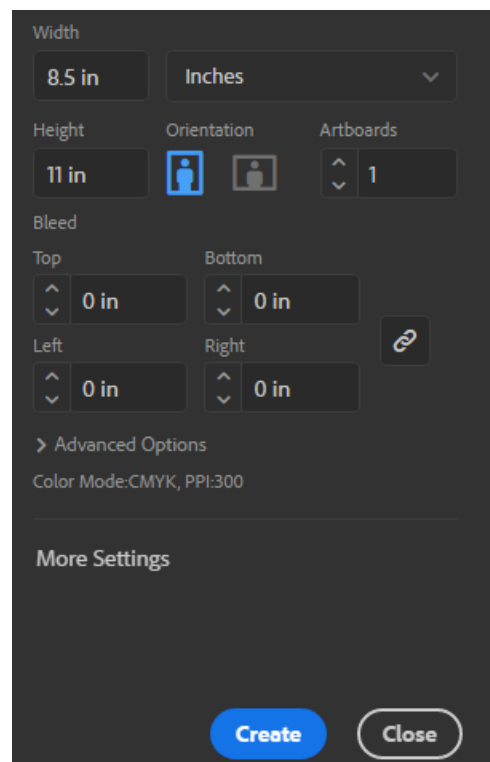
Skills: Swirl Tool, Gradients, Polar Grid, Live Paint Bucket and Transparency

1. File>New. Width = 8.5, Height = 11 and Unit = inches.
Click Create

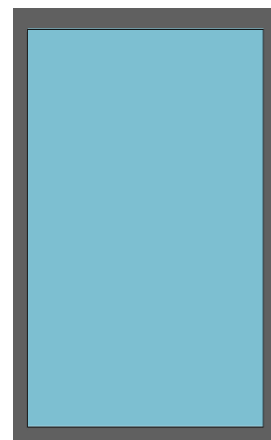
2. Double click the Fill color and change the color to blue #7dbfd1. Just type 7dbfd1 by the #.



3. Select your Rectangle tool. Click on your artboard. This will open the Rectangle menu. Width = 6.5 in and Height = 8 in



4. With the Black Arrow tool, move the blue rectangle to cover your artboard like this:



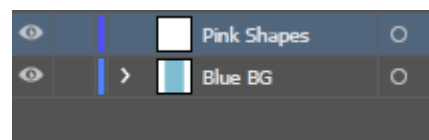
5. Double-click the layer and rename it Blue BG (BG = Background). If you can't see the Layers panel, go to Window>Layers.



6. Create a new layer by clicking the Create New Layer button:



7. Double-click the new layer and name it Pink Shapes

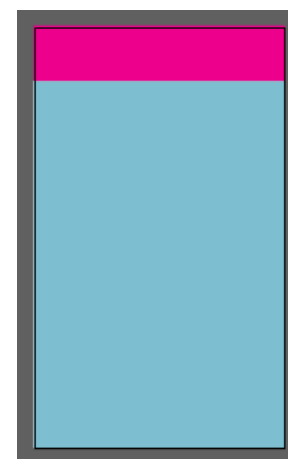


8. Select the Rectangle tool. Set the Fill color to pink and the Stroke color to None.



9. Draw a rectangle and place it at the top of the artboard as shown:

10. Select the pink rectangle with the Black Arrow tool.



11. Select the White Arrow tool. This is the Direct Selection tool. Click the bottom right circle. When you click it, it will turn white. Make sure you only select that circle.



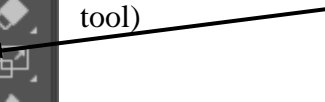
12. Drag the circle to the left to create this shape:



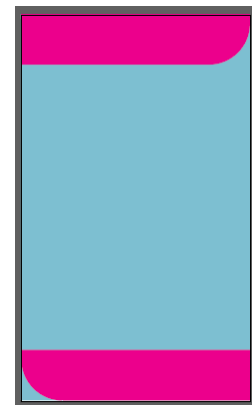
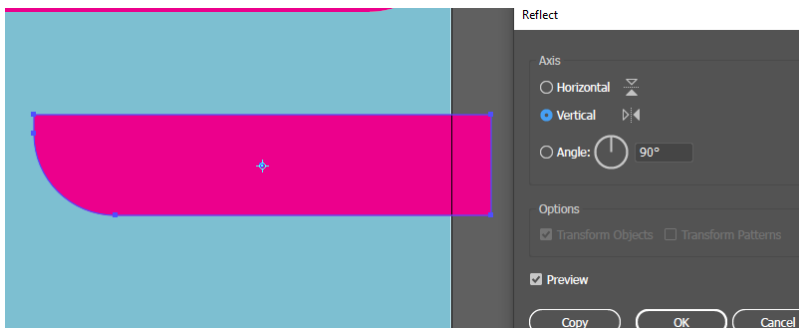
13. Select the shape with the Black Arrow selection tool. Go to Edit>Copy, Edit>Paste.



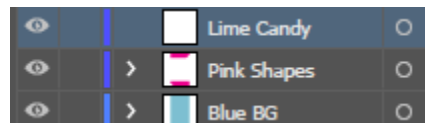
14. Select your Reflect tool (you may need to click the Rotate tool to see the Reflect tool)



15. Select the pink shape copy with the Black Arrow tool. Double-click the Reflect tool. Click Preview to see the reflected copy. Click OK. Click the Black Arrow tool. Place the pink shape as shown:



16. Create a new layer. Rename it Lime Candy.



17. Set the Fill color and the Stroke color to None.



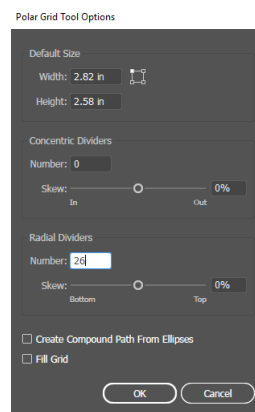
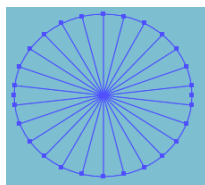
18. Hold down the Line Segment tool to open the menu.



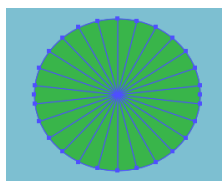
19. Select the Polar Grid tool



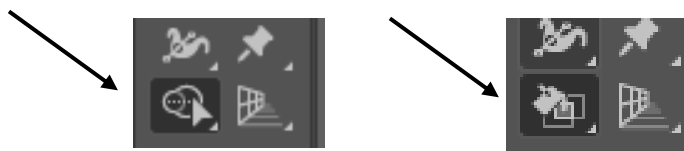
20. Click on the artboard. Set the Concentric Dividers to 0 and the Radial Dividers to 26. Click OK. You should get this:



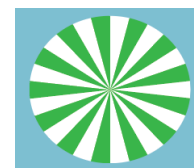
21. Select a lime green Fill color for the shape:



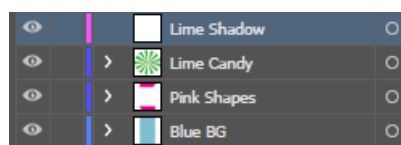
22. Hold down the Shape Builder tool to open the menu. Select Live Paint Bucket.



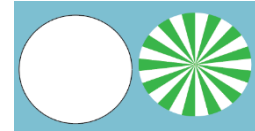
23. Click on a line with the Live Paint Bucket. This create a “Live Paint Group”. Now change the Fill color to white and fill in the shape as shown. Click the Black Arrow tool and click on the artboard to deselect the candy shape.



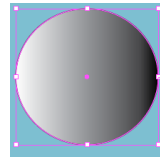
24. Create a new layer. Rename it Lime Shadow.



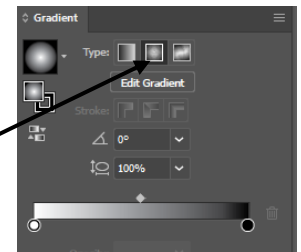
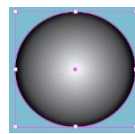
25. Set the Fill color to white and Stroke to black. Select the Ellipse tool. Hold SHIFT and draw circle the same size as the candy shape.



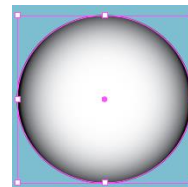
26. Select the white circle. Click the black and white gradient color on the swatch menu.



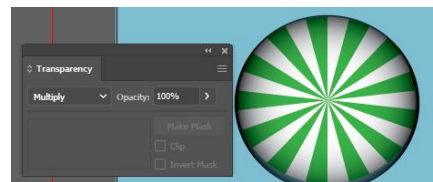
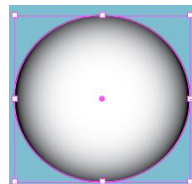
27. Go to Window>Gradient to open the gradient menu. Click Radial. You should get this:



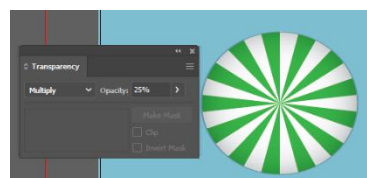
28. On the gradient menu, drag the slider button to the right as far as you can. This will brighten the circle.



29. Place the circle on top of the candy shape to hide the candy. Go to Window>Transparency and select Multiply.

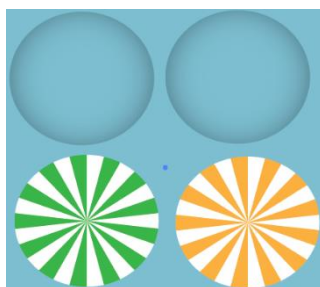
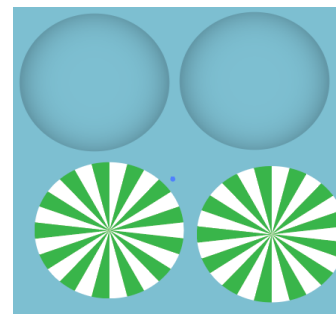


30. Change the Opacity on the Transparency menu to 25%. You should have something like this:

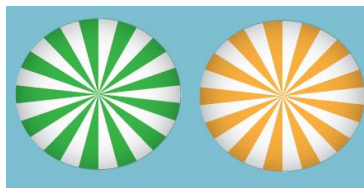


31. Drag your shadow off of the candy. Select the candy. Edit>Copy, Edit>Paste to make a copy. Then make a copy of the shadow:

32. Select a candy. Select the Live Paint Bucket. Choose any color you like and change the color to make another candy flavor.



32. Move the shadows back onto the candy:
